

The Yacht Week Arrival Information in Croatia

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Before TYW

Booking Interest List

We still have a **few boats available**, so tell your friends and get them to sign up to the [Booking Interest List](#). Once they have filled out the form we will do our best to find you a yacht. In total we will accept another 20-30 yachts to join.

Priority password on the waiting list: "**YACHTMENOW**" - in the comment field. That will help your friends to get a yacht quicker!

Crew List

Please make sure that you have filled out your crew list. **This is extremely important so that we know who is on each yacht.** If you do not do this there will be problems with your insurance. [Login](#) to your booking with your registered Email address and password and use our Facebook application. Just add the friend you want on your crew from facebook.

What to pack?

There isn't much need for special sailing gear, besides the obvious swimming clothes, sunscreen and sunglasses. Weather in the Mediterranean is warm, so if you're used to sailing in Scandinavia, you need less warm clothes than you think. Important things to remember are:

- Pack your stuff in a soft bag; it is easier to storage on board.
- Don't bring too much luggage. The space for stowing personal stuff is pretty limited on a yacht.
- There are towels and sheets on board, but bring an extra towel for the beach.
- We will be selling our Yacht Week Collection at a very good price

Money

You should change your money to Kunas, euros are not used here and anything paid for in Euros will be far more expensive if they accept Euros at all. Most small bars/clubs on small islands do not accept cards. Cash is king on Islands.

Insurance

The Insurance is issued by the Yachting Company and is a Kasko insurance (full insurance), also third party insurance and insurance for the crew. Insurance papers are all the time with the clients in the boat documents.

In case of the accident – clients need to call the Yachting Company and nearest Harbor master office (Yachting Company provides the phone numbers) to make a report. If the accident (damage) is caused by skipper's negligence then deposit* money is kept to pay for the damage.

If it is fault of the third party then insurance is covering it. Deposit* is the amount of the franchise, this is the maximum amount of money you will pay in case of damage.

**Login to your booking to see your deposit amount.*

Personal travel insurance for personal injury or disease is also recommended for all guests, which are done domestically with your local insurance provider, as for any journey.

A document should be signed within the group in case the deposit is withheld. The economic responsibility shall be equal among the crew; the skipper shall not cover it himself unless he is a professional skipper which you have requested especially.

Also, the skipper does not pay part of the deposit.

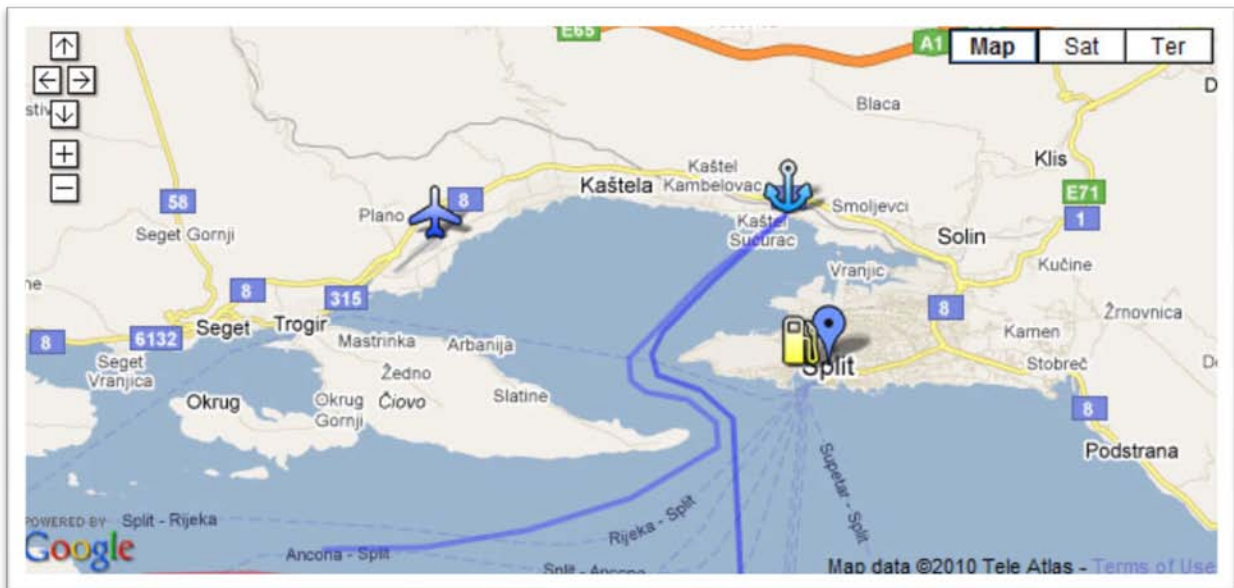


Arrival at The Yacht Week

Transport

Transport between airport and marina Buses are chartered all day to transfer guests from Split airport to Kastela Marina. The Transfer is 8€ or 50 Kuna and is paid cash on the bus in Kuna.

Make sure you **fill out your flight details including your flight number** in your booking so we can make sure there will be a bus waiting for you. **The bus will be waiting for you just outside the entrance to the airport.**

The Yacht Week Card

Online we will be selling our "Yacht Week Card" for **60 euro**. No entrance to anything without the card as cash management is not allowed in Croatia as a foreign company! All cards need to be pre paid. Info about this will come this summer before they arrive. Authorities are very strict with this and therefore this is the only solution for us to arrange parties.

The card includes entrance fees to:

- Outdoor midnight party on Vis, Vis Island
- Beach Club Aquarius on Komiza, Vis Island
- Afterbeach at Amfora on Hvar
- Night Club at Hvar in the evening
- Open air party on Solta!
- Regatta party at Hemingway in Split



All parties will be hosted The Yacht Weeks resident DJ's who have been flown in especially!

TYW staff team will be on site and make sure that every party will be great!

Check-In

In the Marina there is an air-conditioned arriving hall on the 2nd floor where the crew can put your luggage and wait for the check-in to be completed. Start by sending just the booker upstairs and we'll let them know exactly at what time to check-in with their yachting company. Make sure to watch your luggage during this time. The Yacht Week Staff will be upstairs and be available to help all bookers. Here you will also be able to buy clothes from our collection.

Check-in time is on Saturday from 14:00 to 17:00 (2-5pm), and may be completed earlier for some boats all depending on when the cleaning of the boat is finished. Check-in must be completed before sunset, otherwise it has to be done the following morning (but you can still sleep on the yacht).

How does the check-in work?

Only the skipper and booker do the actual check-in. If you have an external skipper, then the booker should go with them in order to pay the deposit* and comfort package. Wait outside the yachting company's office until it is your turn.

**Login to your booking to see your deposit amount.*

At the registration the...

- Deposit is handed over (1000-2500€ depending on boat)*. Cash, VISA and MasterCard are accepted. An ATM is available in the Marina. If you pay deposit with credit card the amount will only be reserved on your account.
- Skipper license, VHF license and passports of the whole crew are verified. (Remember to bring original copies!)

Remember to have cash or a credit card ready for paying the deposit when you check in. Check-out is done Friday night or Saturday morning. All boats have to be back at the Marina by 18:00 (6pm) the latest on Friday.



During The Yacht Week

Typical night with TYW

A typical night goes as follows:

- Arrive to the port. Go for a walk around the town, drink a few beers or some wine at a bar.
- Drinks on your yacht (brought by you from the supermarket)
- Dinner on board (if you cook) or at a restaurant
- More drinks on the yachts?!
- To the club/bar. Prices as below. Approx prices in a restaurant/bar:

Croatia - Beer: €3 Drink: €5-7 Bottle of wine: €10-20

You can calculate your own spending from this!

RULES: No loud music at your boat after 22.00 if moored in a port. No music at all at after parties if local people might be disturbed. No external speaker systems allowed at all. WHY?? After meeting all police captains, town Mayors and port police they sent a very clear message: respect the rules and the people of our town and you are more than welcome - otherwise TYW won't be a long lasting concept.

Food Supply

We recommend you arrive at the marina at 13:00 on arrival day to have enough time to buy food & drink supplies and be ready for check-in. The closest supermarket is Getro, located only a few hundred meters from the Marina. We recommend you to buy all your basic supplies here. There are supermarkets at most marinas, but Getro is cheaper than out on the Islands, so it is worthwhile doing your shopping here. Purchase enough food for at least 2 lunches, lots of beverages (water), salt, pepper and basic kitchen inventories. Walk up to the road and go to the right for 5 minutes and you'll see it. A taxi back is affordable.

Please note: Every crew with an external skipper will be responsible for their food. Either when you eat on board or when you eat at restaurants. The skippers work for free and so we want them to enjoy their holiday too. Make sure you treat your skipper like a king and help out whenever you are needed!

Music and Electricity

For playing music on board, all yachts have a car radio with CD-player and speakers installed. However, finding a line-in on the equipment is rare, so your best bet for playing your own music is to bring CD's (if you still use any) or bring an FM-transmitter for your portable music player.

Power on board is 12 V with cigarette-plug outlet, which is charged via the engine generator or a connection to the land grid. There is usually a 230 volt C-type outlet on board as well, but it only supplies power when you are connected to the land grid as in the harbors.

This means that it is only possible to power appliances such as cell phone chargers and hairdryers when you are in a marina with a power connection, unless you have a 12 V charger (the type you would use in a car).



If you really need 230 V power when you are not berthed in a marina with a power connection, you can bring a DC/AC inverter. But if you just want to play music, using the built-in system is recommended and enough for partying.
